

Nepal Earthquake : Children are the first victims. Plan International responds.

Plan International emergency teams are responding to the needs of children and families affected by the devastating earthquake that hit the Kathmandu valley in Nepal on 25 April.

Plan International emergency appeal

More than 7,300 people have been killed and thousands have been injured. The government has declared a state of emergency in the affected areas. Plan's immediate priority is to support children's core needs - including shelter, water, health care, education, emotional support and essential child protection mechanisms.

Plan is working with the government of Nepal, UN agencies, and NGOs to coordinate the distribution of immediate aid. Plan is also trying to reach remote and cut-off rural communities to assess the immediate needs of impacted areas. A rapid needs assessment in the worst affected areas is underway, with local and deployed staff working around the clock to provide aid where it is most needed.

Many Plan International staff around the world have spent the last few days supporting the Plan Nepal and Plan Asia teams - setting up appeals and engaging with the public on local websites and social media.
