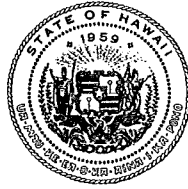

Dear Ms. Cox,

After a review of the required documents, I am pleased to inform you that the data for drinking water analyses is acceptable for regulatory purposes by the Hawaii Department of Health, Safe Drinking Water Branch for *Cryptosporidium* and *Giardia* using EPA Method 1623. The laboratory has retroactive approval since its lapse in January 29, 2016, and is currently approved until January 29, 2018.

All testing for regulatory drinking water purposes must be performed with methods specified in this approval, including all proficiency testing (PT) studies.

The laboratory must successfully complete at least two PT studies from an EPA approved vendor each year or approximately every four to six months to be certified. Failure to do so may result in suspension or downgrading of approval status with the State of Hawaii.

According to Federal Registry notice (Vol. 74, No. 36, p. 8532), an approved laboratory may be downgraded to provisionally approved for failure to meet PT acceptance limits on two out of three regular testing events administered by an approved vendor.

It is the laboratory's responsibility to keep the Hawaii Department of Health Laboratory Certification Program informed by continuing to submit results of applicable PT studies, copies of in-state on-site evaluation reports, and immediate notification of any significant changes including changes to significant personnel, essential equipment, policies or procedures or methodology that directly affect the validity of data, or other changes affecting the capability of the laboratory including change in location.

The approval of your laboratory in Hawaii is based on your in-state and/or your NELAP certification and must therefore be submitted immediately.

To avoid interruption of your approval, you must submit a written request for renewal at least two months prior to the expiration date indicated above.
